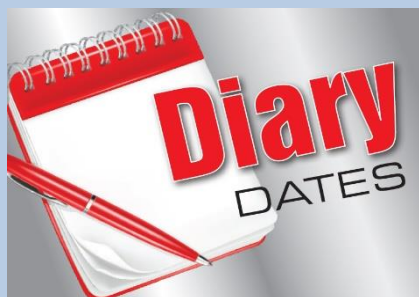

After the success of last year's Jubilee inspired portraits, the Deal Learning Alliance are holding another art competition this time inspired by Climate Change.

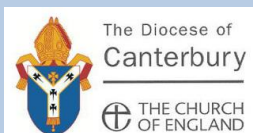

You may use any materials (new or recycled) and techniques or processes (for example drawing, painting, printmaking, textiles, photography, collage, montage) to make your piece.

Winning entries will be chosen from each class before being judged alongside the winning entries from other DLA schools. The overall winners of the competition will be decided by the Art subject Leads from across the DLA. Winning entries will then be displayed in Deal Library for public viewing.

All works of art should be clearly labelled with the school name, pupil name, and year group. Please ensure your entries are no larger than A2 size.

Beech class and Maple class – travel back in time at Dover Castle!

On Tuesday this week our pupils in Beech class and Maple class travelled to Dover Castle to take part in some hands-on learning experiences.

The children had the opportunity to explore The Great Tower, in order to learn more about Henry II and what the castle would have been like in medieval times. They went on a scavenger hunt to find the Drawbridge pit, Becket's chapel, the bread oven, medieval carvings, and the well chamber. Some of the children also had the chance to delve deep into the medieval tunnels, just before the heavy rain came down and the tunnels had to be closed off.



The pupils also enjoyed a workshop with the Constable of the Tower (called Alan) who told them about the history of the castle and why it was built. He taught the pupils all about Henry II and what kind of king he was and explained some of the jobs that people might have had in his court. He took the children on a guided tour of the castle and explained what each room was used for e.g. the throne room, the banquet hall, the kitchen, and the armoury.



The pupils learnt that the King's blankets were made out of squirrel fur while mattresses were made from horse hair! The children even tried out laying on a medieval mattress to compare how comfortable it was with the beds we have today.



A highlight of the day was the chance to dress up in medieval clothes to imagine what life was like as a medieval lady or knight! Both classes had a wonderful day. Thank you very much to all the parent volunteers who helped the trip to run so smoothly.

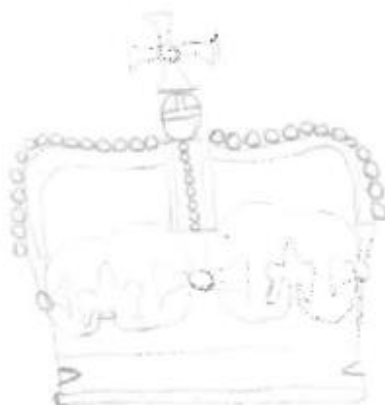
