On Thursday, Oak Class visited Dover Castle as part of their World War Two topic. They learnt more about Operation Dynamo and the rescue of allied troops from Dunkirk, finding out about the command centre in the tunnels below Dover Castle. Following that, they became secret agents, working in an office in the tunnels, completing a secret mission by breaking codes and



ciphers. All the children managed to break the code - with special mention to Elsie who was the first visitor they have had to break the most difficult code without any guidance or support from the Naval Officers leading the mission! They were very impressed and worried she might be chosen to take their jobs!

Our school PTA group, the Friends of Northbourne, will be holding their annual general meeting on *Thursday 12th October* at 2.15pm at the school.


We would like to encourage anyone to come along to the meeting and to get involved with supporting the fundraising and events that the FON organise throughout the year.
