Dear Parents / Carers,

Drop Off Point – please do not block the lane outside of gate opening times

We have had feedback from some of the neighbours close to the school, who report that the lane where the Drop Off Point is located is being blocked by waiting cars significantly earlier than the gate opening.

Please can we ask all those who use the Drop Off Point in the morning, not to park and block the lane outside of the gate opening time. The gate will not open until 8.30am.



Please can we ask the Year 5 and Year 6 parents who use the Drop Off Point for end of day pick up, not to park and block the lane outside of the gate opening time. The gate will not open until 3.10pm.

Thank you for your support with this. As you know, the Drop Off Point is essential to help manage the car traffic around the school site. We need to use it carefully in order to minimise disruption to our community.

Headlice

Recently, cases of head lice have been identified across the school and we wanted to make sure you were kept informed.

Whilst lice can be nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread.

As there has been cases in school, we suggest that you check your child's head as soon as possible. Here is some simple advice you may wish to follow to keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum.

- Check your child's hair once a week.
- Use a proper detection comb – with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart to trap head lice. The comb is usually white in colour so that lice can be easily identified.
- If you find live lice, consult a pharmacist to check the whole family.
